Part 4: Seeking Peace Through Reconciliation

If another member of the community sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one.

Matthew 18:15

One cannot lightly set out on the journey through conflict nor conduct it without a high cost. We see the pain and anguish in the encounters. In general we think about reconciliation as a single encounter bound to the time and place where enemies meet face to face...What happens [in reconciliation] is not neatly bound up in a single encounter. Along the way, encounters happen episodically, as metaphorical moments when we notice God's truth breaking into our lives...The journey through conflict toward reconciliation always involves turning to face oneself.
