Poulnabrone means "the hole in the mill stones." This ancient megalith, thought to have been built in the Neolithic period (between 4200 BC and 2900 BC), is one of many passage tombs that can be found throughout Ireland. This particular passage tomb is found in County Clare, in a region of open, rocky hillsides called The Burren. The twelve-foot limestone slab on top is supported by six-foot high vertical stones. Excavations of the site in the mid-1980s revealed the remains of at least 16 adults and 6 children buried there. It was likely a place of ceremony and ritual well into the Celtic period.
