He has recently completed the requisite training and coursework with the Interim Ministry Network. Shalom is the eighth church his has served as a Transitional Pastor.

Rob and Patty Burdette make their permanent home in Knox County, Ohio. Patty has recently retired from her position as editor of Timbrel Magazine. Prior to that she was a professor of English and American Indian Peace Studies at the Ohio State University and Bluffton University.
