Questions for your reflection on today's service:

- *Youth*: What is your most intimate friendship right now? What do you like to do together? What would you name as key ingredients of intimacy?
- *Parents of young children*: Ask your child, "What do you like most about being part of our family? How is each member of our family like a special friend?" You might braid something (hair, string, etc.) and talk about what makes for a strong friendship.
- *Adults*: In your experience, how can—or do—hardship and transformation sometimes lead to closer relationships? What forms of hardship can get in the way of closeness? What role does God's presence play in your relationships?
- *Older Adults*: As a person ages, they might experience a truly debilitating disease process—Alzheimer's, serious stroke, advanced Parkinson's, and many others—that leaves them in a precarious situation. Companionship is difficult, whether or not one is partnered. How do adults who are ill find closeness with others? How do healthier spouses provide for their needs of companionship and human closeness while still being loving, faithful mates?
