Palm branches were used to welcome victors in war, military heroes who had saved the Jewish people from their enemies. The people wave palm branches and call out "Hosanna" because they anticipate that Jesus will save them from Roman occupation. But the would-be "king of the Jews" doesn't act very kingly. He allows himself to be arrested, to be hung up on wood like a common criminal. When the crowds realize that Jesus isn't the kind of hero they expected, they turn on him. Disappointment turns to rage.
